There are 2 options when it comes to moving your prescriptions to a new pharmacy.

If you are changing pharmacies, consider taking advantage of the opportunity to obtain a 90 day supply at CVS, Walgreens, or Express Scripts Home Delivery.

Option 1: Transfer Your Prescriptions

- Reach Out to Your New Pharmacy:

 Call, go online, or visit your new pharmacy to request a transfer of your prescription(s)from your old pharmacy to your new pharmacy
- Collect Your Health and Insurance Information:

Provide the following information with your request:

- · Date of Birth
- Your first and Last name
- Allergies
- · Address & Phone Number
- · Insurance card Information
- Name and/or prescription numbers for your medications
- Plan Ahead
 Transferring prescriptions can take time. Allow at least 1-3 days for your new pharmacy to receive your prescriptions.

Option 2: Get New Prescriptions

- Some Prescriptions May Not Be Easily
 Transferred:
 - Controlled substance prescriptions may have some restrictions on transfer
 - if your Prescription is out of refills or has expired, it cannot be transferred and will require a new prescription
- 2. Office to Request a New Prescription(s): If you are told by a pharmacy that your prescription(s) cannot be transferred
